Are there services covered before you meet your <u>deductible</u> ?	Yes, the <u>deductible</u> doesn't apply to <u>preventive care</u> or pediatric vision services. If you are an American Indian or a Native Alaskan, and the Marketplace determines you meet certain eligibility requirements, you do not have to pay your deductible, co-pays or co-insurance for a limited number of services.

Important information	Answers
What is the zero cost share provision?	 The zero cost share provision exempts certain items or services from the deductible, co-pays or co-insurance of your plan when they are provided: directly to you by the Indian Health Service, an Indian Tribe, Tribal Organization, or Urban Indian Organization; or through referral under contract health services.
How does zero cost share work?	 If the Provider (Indian Health Service, Indian Tribe, Tribal Organization, Urban Indian Organization, or the provider you see through referral under contract health services) is a Participating Provider, there is no charge. If the Provider (Indian Health Service, Indian Tribe, Tribal Organization, Urban Indian Organization, or the provider you see through referral under contract health services) is a Non-Participating Provider, there is no charge up to a Reasonable and Customary amount.
What are the limitations?	 Services must be Medically/Clinically necessary Services will count toward the same day and/or visit limitations as the services not covered under the zero cost share provision. See your plan documents for additional information.
What is Reasonable and Customary?	Reasonable and Customary is the charge for covered services which is the lower of: (a) the Providers usual charge for any covered service; or (b) the charge we determine to be the prevailing charge level for any covered service.
