

Cerebrovascular accident (CVA) documentation

To capture the full disease burden of a patient’s cerebrovascular condition, follow the documentation guidelines below, as applicable.

Do document: 'Acute stroke/TIA v. 'History' of stroke/TIA	Do document: Weakness (coded as PLEGIA) or hemiparesis
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 'Acute stroke' with the original diagnosis (Emergency or Inpatient) encounter only. 'History of' following acute event encounter if no residual effects. Update the problem list to avoid erroneous prompts in future visits. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Laterality is associated with any weakness or paresis with pertinence to dominance. Coders should default to 'right side dominant' unless otherwise indicated.
Do document: Any deficits the patient experiences	Do document: Ischemic vs hemorrhagic
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Residual effects impact recovery. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <i>Ex: Apraxia, ataxia, cognitive defects, facial weakness, or language impairments.</i> Late effect or sequelae of a CVA; there is no time limit on coding late effects. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Location of ischemia inclusive of specific vessel and laterality when able. Location of a hemorrhage such as subarachnoid, intracerebral, or intracranial.

*Coders can use radiology reports to locate the site, but documentation by a provider is ideal.*¹

Don't:

- Use 'acute stroke' for a follow up outpatient encounter. Acute stroke would be used for an emergency/inpatient type visit.
- Use 'history of CVA/TIA' if residual effects are present, document the residual effects.
