

## **Cerebrovascular accident (CVA) documentation**

To capture the full disease burden of a patient's cerebrovascular condition, follow the documentation guidelines below, as applicable.

<b>Do document:</b>	<b>Do document:</b>
'Acute stroke/TIA v. 'History' of	Weakness (coded as PLEGIA) or
stroke/TIA	hemiparesis
<ul> <li>'Acute stroke' with the original diagnosis (Emergency or Inpatient) encounter only.</li> <li>'History of' following acute event encounter if no residual effects.</li> <li>Update the problem list to avoid erroneous prompts in future visits.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Laterality is associated with any weakness or paresis with pertinence to dominance.</li> <li>Coders should default to 'right side dominant' unless otherwise indicated.</li> </ul>
<b>Do document:</b>	<b>Do document:</b>
Any deficits the patient experiences	Ischemic vs hemorrhagic
<ul> <li>Residual effects impact recovery.         <ul> <li>Ex: Apraxia, ataxia,</li></ul></li></ul>	<ul> <li>Location of ischemia inclusive of</li></ul>

weakness, or language	able. <li>Location of a hemorrhage such</li>

Coders can use radiology reports to locate the site, but documentation by a provider is ideal.  $_1$ 

## Don't:

- Use 'acute stroke' for a follow up outpatient encounter. Acute stroke would be used for an emergency/inpatient type visit.
- Use 'history of CVA/TIA' if residual effects are present, document the residual effects.
