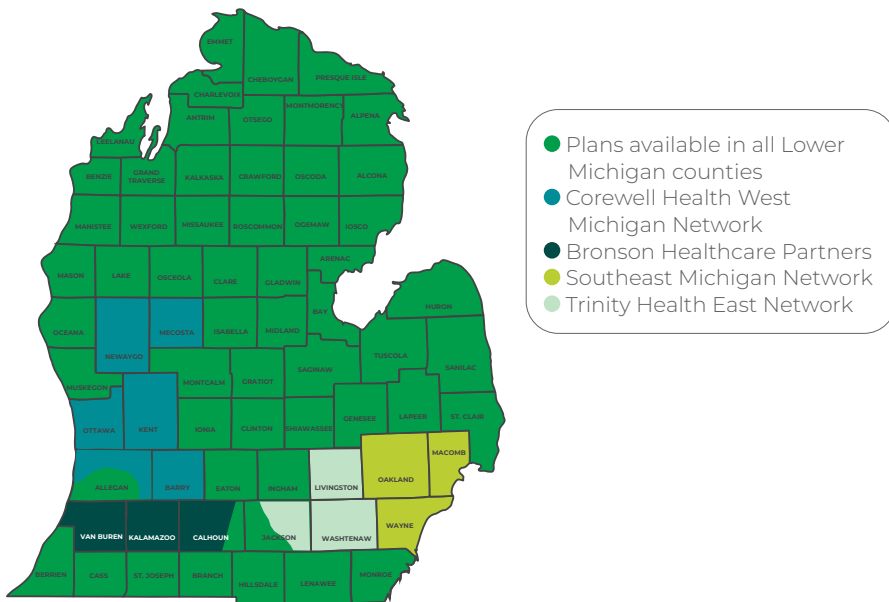


Priority Health narrow networks

We offer plans to individuals and families under age 65 who purchase their own health coverage. Included in these plan offerings are our four narrow network plans, which offer members care with a specific network of doctors and hospitals at a lower cost.

Here are the Michigan counties where individual plans are available, including areas with narrow networks:



Please refer patients to providers within their network. Use Find a Doctor (in the Resources drop-down in prism) to see which providers are in your patient's network. Request authorization for instances where services are not available within their network.

You can tell a patient is a Priority Health narrow network member one of two ways:

1. Use the Member Inquiry tool in prism. The name of the narrow network will appear in the "Product Type" field.
2. Check your patient's member ID card. The name of the narrow network will be listed as the **Health plan** (see sample member ID card on the back).

Members in these counties are now eligible for the Southeast Michigan Network, which includes Trinity facilities and providers along with Corewell Health facilities and providers in Southeast Michigan.

Note: When providers change their primary hospital affiliation, that will impact their participating status with our narrow network products. For example, if a provider was affiliated with a Corewell hospital in Kent County and changed their primary affiliation to a non-Corewell hospital, they would become out-of-network for the Corewell Health West Michigan Network. If a member's plan requires them to designate an in-network PCP, they will be required to choose a new PCP if their current PCP's hospital affiliation changes.
